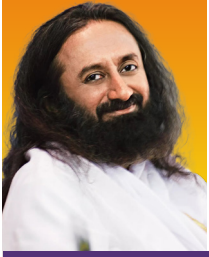

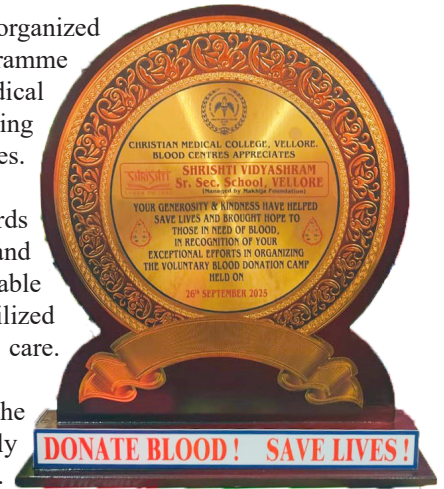


Blood Donation Awareness Program & Camp

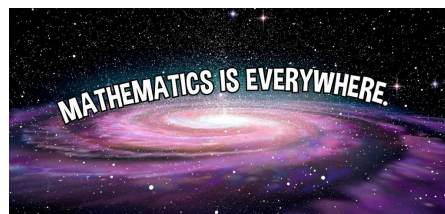
Highlights of the Phonetics Session
