## National Science Day Quiz Competition 2026 – Igniting Young Minds

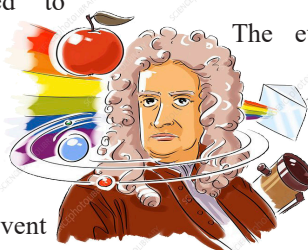
National Science Day 2026 was celebrated with great enthusiasm through an engaging Quiz Competition organized for the students of Grade IX on 2nd March 2026.

## Recognition for Excellence in Teaching



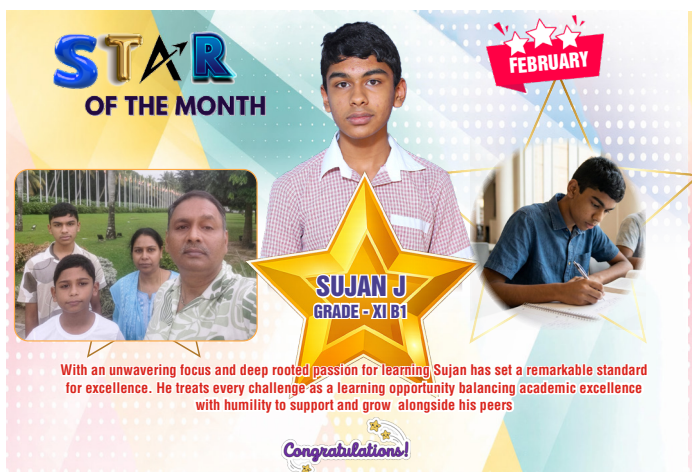

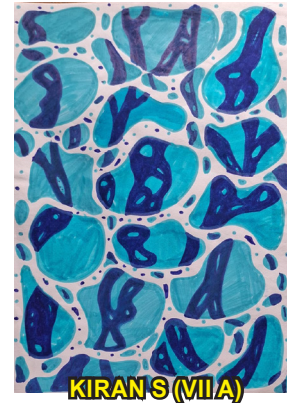

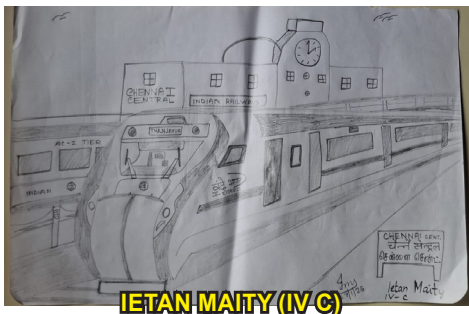
