- **Mahua Tree (Madhuca Longifolia):** Supports respiratory health.
- **Heaven Tree (Ficus Bengalensis):** Provides shade and shelter for birds.
- **Kaduka Tree (Terminalia Anjuna):** Aids digestion.
- **Sundakai Tree:** Enhances oxygen levels and stomach health.

The Heaven Tree stood out for its role in safeguarding bird nests from predators with its dense foliage.

Mr. Devendran also raised awareness about cancer prevention, emphasizing reduced plastic usage and tree planting during special occasions. He highlighted the power of small actions like planting phosphorous-absorbing plants to address environmental challenges.

The government sessions were equally enlightening. At the Parl Connect Gallery in the Parliament of Singapore, we learned about their government structure and policies.

fears.

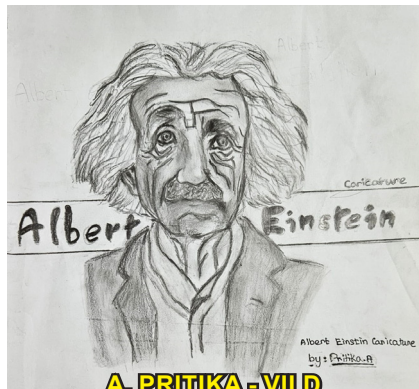
In every breath, hope's voice is clear

And whispers peace, where fears reside.

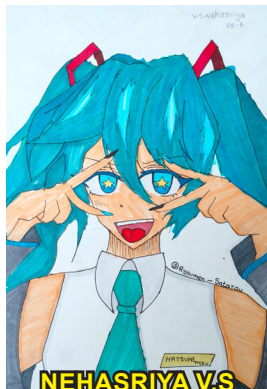
A ray of sunshine after rain

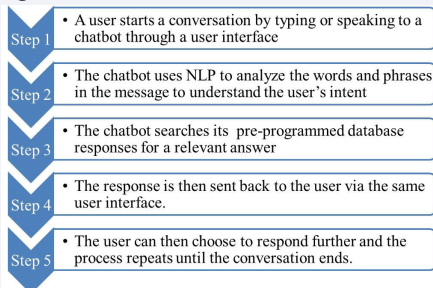
Chatbot

Artificial intelligence (AI) chatbot are a fascinating advancement in today's digital technology landscape. The chatbot are also known as virtual assistants or digital assistants. AI chatbot understand human language with the help of natural language processing (NLP) and respond using artificial intelligence (AI).

The chatbot use rules to generate responses to specific questions. They also utilize NLP, machine learning and natural language understanding (NLU) to learn from user interactions.

When a user interacts with a chatbot, it analyzes the input and tries to understand its intent. It does this by comparing the user's request to a set of predefined keywords and phrases that it has been already programmed to recognize.

A step by step process in Chatbot Based on these keywords and phrases, the chatbot will generate a response that it thinks is most appropriate. The typical interaction flow of a chatbot is shown in figure.



Types of chatbots:

There are rule-based chatbots and AI chatbots. Rule-based chatbots use a decision tree to provide a set of pre-defined options. AI chatbots use machine learning models to understand the intent behind a question and solve the problem without human assistance.

Limitations of chatbots:

Chatbots can have difficulty with non-linear conversations, multiple questions and unsaved queries. They can also provide incorrect or nonsensical answers.
