

Faculty Workshop on AI and Storytelling in Education



On February 21, 2026, the English faculty of Shrishti Matric & Vidyashram attended the AI in Education Workshop conducted at TT725, VIT Vellore. The workshop was organized by VIT's School of Social Sciences and Languages and featured two insightful sessions led by experienced educators.

The first session was conducted by Mr. Cherry Mathew Philipose, who introduced the practical applications of Artificial Intelligence in language teaching. He demonstrated how AI tools can support the development of speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills. Participants were introduced to structured prompt frameworks such as RCTO which helps teachers design

effective AI-assisted lesson plans. Various tools like ELSA Speak, Yoodli.ai, Microsoft Reading Coach, Google Docs “Help Me Write,” and Google Gemini were explored, highlighting how AI can enhance classroom instruction while maintaining the teacher’s central role.

The second session was led by Dr. Blessy Samjose, who focused on storytelling as a powerful pedagogical tool. She emphasized how storytelling builds empathy, improves retention, and strengthens communication skills. Through engaging demonstrations, she showcased how subject concepts such as matrices in mathematics and punctuation in English can be taught through creative narratives.

The workshop concluded with a collaborative brainstorming session where faculty members explored ways to integrate AI-supported storytelling into their own classrooms. The session reinforced the idea that technology, when used thoughtfully, can transform passive learning environments into interactive and student-centered spaces.

Overall, the workshop provided valuable insights into innovative teaching methodologies and equipped faculty members with practical strategies to enhance language learning through AI, drama, and storytelling.
